#### MAKER'S STATEMENT

I make simple sustainable jewellery from the lovely things I gather at low tide along the Suffolk coast. I use sea glass, stones, and fragments of shell and ceramic - all tumbled smooth by the sea. I don't polish my finds. They are entirely crafted by the waves over decades, possibly centuries. I carefully drill and arrange them with sterling silver or gold on a variety of cords.

I love the idea of adorning oneself with precious memories, associations and hidden histories - perhaps a special stone found by a friend on a long walk. I also like to think I'm recycling the lost city of Dunwich, the old pier at Southwold, or just giving new life to a discarded bottle. I have finds from other parts of the UK too, and from around the world - found by myself, family, friends and even kind strangers who have wandered into my pop-up studio at the Alde Valley Spring Festival during Open Studios. Sometimes, after exchanging passions for places, they've returned the following weekend with a piece of treasure for me.

It's always such an honour and a pleasure to be part of the Spring Festival - I shall really miss everyone this year, the warmth and support of the festival team, and other wonderful artists and makers - and of course the lovely visitors - many familiar faces and always to my surprise many new ones each year too. The farm is the perfect inspirational setting - ideas and delicious food are shared, lots of tea and walks happen and collaborations evolve. I enjoyed joining forces with Eilidh Allan to create some gorgeous earrings, and I'm loving threading sea glass onto beautiful silk cord hand spun by Sarah Butters.

I shall miss deciding what beach finds to carefully pack up and bring to White House Farm to display and share in my pop-up studio. Its a chance to rearrange and reassess. But one of the best things are the memories and conversations these finds often generate with festival visitors people share their wonderful stories of long walks and wonderings, distant beaches and favourite finds. I now keep a note book solely for these kind of recommendations - beaches, walks, books, artists, films and even little maps that people have drawn for me so I might one day find the exact spot where beach combing brought them such joy.

With the current Festival and Open Studios now online, please do feel free to contact the Festival office to share your stories to pass on to me—or to commission a necklace of earrings with a stone or shell or piece of sea glass that is special to you. Occasionally someone will ask me

to make something for them using their own special finds, or in a way I may not have thought of before, which is always a pleasure and good to step out of my comfort zones. Sometimes quite ordinary stones or sea glass that are not especially beautiful in their own right, but are held dear, can become very beautiful once combined with other small elements, or a little silver or gold. They can have a humble modest beauty that is all about a memory.

Jewellery bought or commissioned will arrive with a tiny label saying where it was found, and in a natural recycled card gift box tied with raffia. My details are on the inside lid should you have any problems or ever need it restrung. It's helpful in these strange and worrying times to have something positive to focus on. Thanks Jason for keeping it all going online.
