Hedgerows are a vital refuge for birds. A good thick hedge full of hawthorn, blackthorn, hazel, crab apples, ivy, brambles and roses provides food, shelter and nesting sites for song birds and a larder for magpies, jays and sparrowhawks. To highlight the importance of hedges for bird life, the Festival offered the farm's Hedge Hut to Becky Munting for a *Rebirding Residency*. With this was an invitation to represent in oil paintings as many bird species as possible that live on the farm. The residency, which is now ongoing, coincides with a series of *Rebirding Projects* that were launched at the farm in early 2020 - inspired by Benedict Macdonald's book *Rebirding*. It is hoped that these will significantly boost the number of bird species that live on the farm - all captured in Becky Munting's beautiful paintings. ARTIST'S STATEMENT

Over the past few years, my painting has focused on the wildlife that I have found in the immediate vicinity of my studio. I am lucky enough to have a wildflower garden, and to be surrounded by fields and hedges. However, it was very noticeable that a lot of the wildlife was gathered directly around houses and gardens, where there are shrubs and bushes for cover and nesting, and quite often food sources too. The large arable fields and bushwhacked hedges appear to provide very little habitat for insects and birds. They often appear barren of bird life, other than species introduced for "sport", such as pheasants and partridges. Dead bees are a common sight on the edges of tracks and roads.

Being offered the *Hedge Hut Residency*, and the freedom to wander through the woods and meadows at White House Farm was a wonderful opportunity. The re-wilding projects undertaken by Jason at the farm are creating additional habitats and food sources for many different species. The lack of use of pesticides on the grassland and farm gardens will allow more insect and bugs to thrive and these, in turn, will provide food for birds.

February was somewhat blighted by strong winds and the necessary ground and tree work to create new woodland spaces for birds. However, even with this disruption, the birds have enough space and cover to thrive. I could reliably go to one particular area of the wood opposite the cottage and know I would see tree creepers, gold crests and woodcocks. Having the time to sit and study the birds to better understand what places these species are likely to favour was - and is - fantastic.

Due to the circumstances beyond our control, my time in the *Hedge Hut* was cut short, but Jason has agreed that I can continue the Residency throughout the rest of this year. The migratory birds will be arriving, and the new habitats will begin to bed into the landscape. It will be an exciting time to see what and who appears.
